Property news: Jetfly offers its planes to the NHS to transport medics and PPE

Personal protective equipment is coming to a hospital near you — in a private jet. Doctors and nurses could be starting their shifts in high-flying fashion too after Jetfly, a private plane company, offered the use of its fleet to the NHS.

Typically employed to shuttle millionaires and celebrities from their homes in Chelsea to hotels in Monaco, the Pilatus PC-12s and PC-24s are grounded for all but essential travel.

Jonathan Clough, Jetfly's UK sales director, has told the government that it can use its 40 planes to transport medical staff and equipment for free.

Clough said he was inspired by his 70-year-old doctor father, who came out of retirement to join the battle against coronavirus.

His wealthy clients are footing the bill, and donated 200 hours of flight time in a single day (the equivalent of £500,000, Jetfly says). The first flight full of healthcare professionals flew from

Grenoble, France, to Ajaccio, Corsica, on April 7.
